

**THE HISTORY OF THE AMERICAN DIET AND ITS
RELATIONSHIP TO CHRONIC DISEASE**



Dr. Boyd, a practicing medical oncologist since 1993, is the founding president of the Integrative Care Cancer Foundation, which focuses on a new and growing movement in cancer treatment, emphasizing scientific understanding of both alternative and traditional medicine therapies, and their responsible integration with conventional health care in clinical practice. Integrative care includes therapeutic interventions in diet, lifestyle, exercise, stress care, and nutritional supplements, as well as experimental vaccines, chronotherapies, and other advanced treatments. In his words: “What integrative cancer care should be doing is integrating knowledge from all aspects of medicine and health---epidemiology and public health, nutritional medicine, endocrinology, as well as oncology and complementary medicine—in the care of the cancer patient. The key is not to think ‘outside the box’, but to develop a bigger box.”

Dr. Boyd is a pioneer in the field of integrative cancer care, with a targeted focus of nutritional support for cancer patients. Incorporating emergent evidence-based medical oncology with cancer specific nutritional counseling he combines comprehensive support for the healing process.

Dr. Boyd received his medical degree from Cornell University Medical College. He completed his fellowship in Hematology Oncology at New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center in New York, and is presently an attending physician at Greenwich Hospital -- Yale Medical Center. At Yale, he is Director of Nutritional Oncology, Assistant Clinical Professor, the Director of Curriculum in Nutrition, and the Director of Curriculum of Integrative Medicine. He was recruited to develop and direct the Nutrition and Integrative Medicine Curricula at Yale which he headed through 2012. He was appointed Director of Cancer Nutrition for the Yale Health System and is developing a Center for Cancer Nutrition Education. Dr. Boyd has also recently published a book entitled, *The Cancer Recovery Plan*.
