“Advances in Radiology Therapy in Cancer”



Dr. Bruce McGibbon, Director of Radiation Oncology at Greenwich Hospital, will present a lecture on the “Advances in Radiology Therapy in Cancer.”

His talk will focus on the latest updates in radiation oncology and the newest therapies available to treat many different types of cancer. He will discuss stereotactic radiation, radiation biology, and combining chemotherapy and radiation therapy for malignancies including prostate cancer, lung cancer, and brain cancer and other types of cancer.

A graduate of the David Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA, he also trained in Radiation Oncology there. He is board certified in radiation oncology and has been an Assistant Professor in the Department of Therapeutic Radiology at Yale University School of Medicine since 2009. He is the Medical Director of Radiation Oncology for the Smilow Cancer Care Center in Greenwich and is director of radiosurgery at Yale Medicine’s Radiation Oncology Center in Trumbull.

As a radiation oncologist, Bruce McGibbon, MD, often faces the difficult job of determining the best treatment approach for cancer patients. “I care deeply about cancer patients and their families,” he explains, “and I am fortunate to practice a specialty that allows me the ability to help cure cancer and palliate symptoms. I am most excited about the further applications of short-course radiation therapy using stereotactic techniques.” He strives to provide the best care for his patients every day. “When patients feel comfortable, listened to, and cared for, then I know that I'm really making a positive difference in their lives,” he says.
