TODAY'S SPEAKER

Alisyn Camerota is a journalist employed by the cable news channel CNN

as an anchor on its morning news show. She is a graduate of American University in Washington, D.C. with a degree in Broadcast Journalism and a minor in Criminal Justice. Prior to her job with CNN she worked at the Fox News Channel and a number of other stations. Alison's day starts at 3:30AM, and is in a car by 3:45AM reviewing current news stories. She is at work by 4:45AM. The news show starts at 6AM. The news program is assisted by a staff of 50 including investigators, reporters, writers and producers. In the pursuit of the truth, Alisyn says she follows the rules of broadcast journalism, including these two: check your biases at the door and double check your sources. A single source is sat on until it can be confirmed by a second source. The foregoing helps avoid fake news, made up stories, and fiction writers promoting a point of view. In the struggle for truth, the journalist must distinguish fact from feelings.
