#### TODAY'S SPEAKER

**Veronica Bilenkin**, Consumer Health Librarian of Greenwich Hospital, discussed the services that she provides to the public on specific health issues. Two anonymous donors have endowed a "Greenwich Community Health Library" in honor of Dr. Steven Mickley.

Dr. Mickley himself spoke to us about this gift, made 5 years ago, with the purpose of providing an ongoing benefit to the public. This service is "free and open" to the public in all our surrounding communities in order to allow patients and their families to make informed decisions about health care. The Library, housed in GHA's Medical Library, is staffed full-time and is unique in Connecticut.

Ms. Bilenkin provided an overview of her mission: to allow individuals to make informed health care decisions. Located on the first floor of the Watson Pavilion, the facility is open from Monday to Friday from 9 am to 4 pm. but is also accessible by email. Two additional staff members assist the Librarian. The aim is to provide "health literacy" to the large proportion of our population who need assistance in this area. (Health literacy has been shown to be deficient in non-English speakers and in adults over 60 years of age.)

Simply relying on internet searches is fraught with pitfalls, misinformation and scams. Ms. Bilenkin emphasized the value of searches on MedlinePlus - no ads, sponsored by the National Library of Medicine, thoroughly researched and fact-checked. The Greenwich Hospital Medical Library provides one on one consultation, a comfortable reading area, a reference collection, computers, printers and wireless access.
