TODAY'S SPEAKER

Dr. Richard C. Connors, MD, is a dermatologist who practices in Greenwich and is **Section Head of Dermatology at Greenwich Hospital**. He opened his remarks by noting the RMA is an appropriate audience, because, as people age, they become less immune to diseases such as skin cancer. As he described the different types of skin cancer, Dr. Connors noted that Basal Cell Carcinoma is the most prevalent in cancer patients and that Melanoma is least common, but most difficult to treat. To prevent skin cancer from developing Dr. Connors suggested sunscreen, even the best sunscreen is not 100% effective, and that avoiding long stays in direct sunlight and wearing appropriate clothing is best. He indicated there is no safe tan, and strongly warned against using indoor tanning methods. Dr. Connors provided the audience with a guide to skin cancers. He urged all to learn the indicators of skin cancer development and to conduct regular self-examinations.
