TODAY'S SPEAKER

HORST TEBBE introduced **Nina Willner**, author and former U.S. Army Intelligence officer who related a complicated story of what happened to her family during the Cold War. Based on her book, "Forty Autumns," which was cited as one of the fifteen non-fiction must-read books of 2016, she wove her family's personal story with the history of a divided Germany. In the east, where she and her family lived, were eighteen million people trapped under a brutal dictatorship. She covered the four decade clash of communism and democracy, the Soviet-American superpower fight for dominance in the space race, the nuclear arms race, and battles around the globe that brought the world to the brink of nuclear war. At the age of 20, her mother made a risky escape leaving behind her parents and 7 siblings to settle in Heidelberg in West Germany where she worked for the US Embassy. She met and married a US Army Intelligence officer, a Jew who was at Auschwitz and other concentration camps, but he eventually escaped. They emigrated to the US, where Ms Willner and her 5 siblings were born. There were too many more details and stories for her 50 minute presentation, but they are covered in her book. However, she did relate some of her exciting and dangerous exploits as an Army intelligence officer serving in Berlin during the Cold War.
