## TODAY'S SPEAKER

**Adam Frankel** was a senior speechwriter for President Obama, during his election campaigns and while in office. He also worked in the Clinton White House. His talk concerned, what he called “the coarsening of public discourse”. How it happened, what it means, why it’s important and how to avoid it or at least lessen its impact. The not-so-magic bullets he cited were; to maintain your values; speak clearly and simply; respect the other side; and vet your facts.
