PROGRAMS

STEVE MYERS introduced today's program. Professor Steven Levitsky will discuss his view that American Democracy is crisis, what is involved, and the future outlook. Professor Levitsky received his B.A. in Political Science from Stanford, his Ph.D. from the Univ. of California at Berkley and has been on the faculty at Harvard since 2000.

ARTHUR STAMPLEMAN introduced next week's speaker Dr. Harold Shapiro, who will discuss genetic engineering and therapy.

TODAY'S SPEAKER

Professor Steven Levitsky has titled his presentation *American Democracy in Crises: Outlook for the Future*. Levitsky believes that U.S. democracy is under serious threat and has fallen into crises over the last decade. He claims that the U.S. Constitution is never enough and what is needed is strong democratic rule and a relationship where rivals are not treated as enemies. Levitsky argues that this polarization has occurred over the last half century and has been brought about by racial and cultural re-alignments. He lists three threats going forward: (1) a slide into autocracy as voter choices are not implemented; (2) a slide into dysfunction by the lack of mutual toleration and failure to observe the separation of powers and (3) a slide into minority rule. In this writer's opinion, Professor Levitsky used a large portion of his talk to strongly malign the character and competence of the President of the U.S., Donald Trump, the Trump Administration, the republicans in Congress, and republican governors in states where they preside. In other parts of his presentation, Levitsky calls for a return to comity and mutual respect, and he evidently believes that President Donald Trump, the Trump Administration, and many republicans do not merit such treatment.
