Daryl Hawk

“Colombia: Light at the Edge of the World”



International documentary photographer and explorer Daryl Hawk will give an illustrated presentation on his expedition to the northwestern provinces of Colombia this past March. He will discuss his artistic philosophy, style, equipment, and the various techniques he uses to create his photographic images.

Hawk went to Colombia to shoot a documentary for magazines. He will share his day-to-day adventures and will describe the insights he learned on this spiritual journey.

Hawk embarked alone on a 1600-mile trek starting in the city of Cartagena. He followed the highest coastal mountain range in the world—the Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta range. His adventure took him to the vast Guajira Peninsula which has some of the most rugged and spectacular desert landscapes in Colombia. La Guarija is home to the Wayuu an indigenous people, who have maintained their independent way of life for centuries. Hawk noted, “I love wild country where my mind can run free and fast with the constant visual stimulation I experience from dawn to dusk. Every single day in Colombia was filled with pure magic.”

For the past thirty years, Daryl Hawk has explored some of the most remote and isolated places in the world telling, stories with his camera. His photographs appear in magazines and publications worldwide. He is a member of the Explorers Club, a fellow of the Royal Geographical Society, and member of the Professional Photographers Association. He has been featured several times on NBC’s “Today Show” and Fox 5 television. He is the author of five photography books.

Hawk owns and operates a photography studio and “Unconventional Travelers,” a small personalized tour company, in Wilton, Connecticut. Trips for 2019 and 2020 will go to Cuba, Patagonia, Peru, Colombia, and Ecuador. Website: www.darylhawk.com
