From 2007 to the present, Dr. Amato has served a psychologist and member of the medical staff at the Hudson Valley Health Care System in Montrose, New York. His duties are to lead a team of clinicians in providing rapid response to any request for services throughout the Hudson Valley Region within a maximum of 24 hours. To educate and inform employees, across the entire continuum of care and who have direct contact with Veterans, how to recognize the signs of potential suicide including risk

factors and warning signs, how to alert professional staff, and other intervention options. To ensure that Veterans receive timely care when faces with a crisis, particularly when they have made a call to the Hotline.
