## **Joel Seligman**

### **“Mining, Refining and Restoring Photographic Images in the Digital Age”**



Around the world, billions of digital photos are taken daily, mostly by cell phones, where they are also stored. How many are worth keeping? Can they be improved by editing? How can they be retrieved easily when you want to see or show them? What can or should you do with the loads of “old fashioned” paper photos you have stored in boxes or albums from long ago? Is it necessary to use a professional service to optimize and beautify your collection, or are there tools that we amateurs can readily use? All these and other questions will be answered by Joel Seligman who will explain the new world of digital photography.

Joel Seligmann has been a professional photographer for over 40 years. He owns his own photography business, called the Shadow Box, specializing in weddings, bar mitzvahs, and corporate events, as well as school and camp portraits. He has a website called [theverybest.com](http://theverybest.com), where he exhibits his artistic work. Presently, he is the photographer-in-residence at Lyon Farm in Greenwich and continues to do select events.

He also teaches computers and photography, privately, in and around Greenwich. For roughly the same 40 years, Mr. Seligmann was an English teacher at Rye Neck High School in Mamaroneck, NY, where he also taught electives in computer applications and darkroom photography.
