Joseph Roberto, Superintendent

Department of Public Works – Highway Division



Joseph Roberto has been Highway Superintendent for the town of Greenwich since September 1996. He received a BS in Management from Fairfield University (1976) and has followed with continuing education in all phases of both Professional Engineering and Operations Management. He has attended the University of Connecticut's Transportation Institute of Technology Center – Road Master and Road Scholar.

For twenty-four years prior to being hired by the Town of Greenwich as Highway Superintendent, Mr. Roberto was employed in the Heavy and Highway construction industry where he held positions at every level, working his way up from laborer, truck driver, and foreman, to superintendent. This experience has given him a deep understanding of engineering practices, road/bridge construction, utility installation, snow and ice control and equipment maintenance.

Mr. Roberto's work history is extensive, ranging from working on foundations, curbs, sidewalks, roads, parking lots, utilities and superstructures for multi-unit housing projects to municipal sewer and utility projects for various towns and cities in Connecticut. All of these projects required engineering skill and the use of surveying instruments and levels to shoot grades; setting up lasers to establish line and grade of pipe lines, and a State of Connecticut P-7 Contractor's License which allows him to procure permits as required by State law. He has also worked on State and Federal DOT multi-million dollar highway projects on I-95, Merritt Parkway, Routes 8, 110, and US 1.

Since 1996, he and his department have refined general services contracts enabling the Highway Maintenance Program to attack drainage, curbing and sidewalk rehabilitation projects to solve problems and revitalize infrastructure. The greatest areas of improvement have been in the Asphalt Paving Program.

Some of Mr. Roberto's most notable accomplishments have been his ability to lead the Highway Division to be the first *Team of the Year, 1999 & 2011*, as well as having been chosen as *Manager of the Year, 2003*.

With all the technical and administrative skills he has acquired, Mr. Roberto believes that the ability to interact effectively with both personnel and the public is the most important. He says that Greenwich is blessed with a talented staff that only needs to be led in a positive direction.
