

## **Laurence Kantor, Ph.D.**

### **“The Economy, Financial Markets and the Pandemic: Where Do We Go From Here?”**



The economy was rolling along positively- a glassy sea: employment was virtually full, the stock market was booming and fears of recession were nearly non-existent. Then the corona virus pandemic hit (bam!) and the calm sea transformed into a tsunami- over 40 million workers suddenly found themselves unemployed, the Dow Jones average tumbled over 10,000 points and recession became inevitable. Worse, 100,000 lives have been lost as a result of the virus, shelter in place has become the order of the day and how we go about our daily affairs has changed immeasurably for the foreseeable future. On top of all of this, the death of George Floyd in Minneapolis has given the tsunami added

force. So what's up?

Please join us to hear Larry Kantor, who will draw on his many years as a senior leader in the financial industry to tackle burning economic issues of the day arising from the pandemic. Larry has appeared on three previous occasions before the RMA and has received wide praise for his clear, concise and comprehensible views on national issues from an economist's perspective. Larry was a 2016 Advanced Leadership Institute Fellow at Harvard University following his retirement as Managing Director and Global Head of Research at Barclays where he was responsible for global research, including economics, equities, interest rates, foreign exchange, emerging markets, credit and commodities. He was also a member of the investment bank Executive Committee and made numerous media appearances, including CNBC, Bloomberg TV and radio, The Nightly Business Report and CBS Evening News.

Larry joined Barclays in 2003 as Head of Economics and Market Strategy. Prior to that time he held several positions of increasing responsibility in academia, the government and the financial industry. Larry received his Ph.D. and MA in Economics from Ohio State University.
