

## Laszlo Birinyi

## Words of Wisdom about the Economy and the Stock Market from the Experts' Expert



It is the best of times; it is the worst of times. It is a time of economic confusion; it is a time of more economic confusion. Who better to make sense of the financial world than Laszlo Birinyi, the experts' expert, the man to whom The Wall Street Journal, Barron's, Forbes, Business Week, CNBC and Bloomberg TV all regularly turn to for insight about Wall Street.

After working at Salomon Brothers from 1976 to 1989, Mr. Birinyi left to found the Westport-based

company, Birinyi Associates, a money management and research firm. The firm has three main areas of focus: US equity research, global equity research and money management. It has long stressed picking strong individual stocks that can resist market volatility.

The firm is unique is that it does not analyze the economy, nor does it pay much attention to traditional, technical, quantitative or other market indicators. Its approach is to understand the psychology of the market and, most importantly, the history of investors.

Roughly a month ago, Mr. Birinyi stayed positive on the stock market, opining that Gross Domestic Product could surprise on the upside based on the recent run of a number of cyclical stocks. In a CNBC interview, he told investors not to disregard the possibility of "something good happening." But what does Mr. Birinyi think today? Mr. Birinyi, who is married with two daughters, graduated from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (where he established the Laszlo Birinyi Sr. Distinguished Professorship in Hungarian Studies, to honor his father), and received an MBA from the New York University School of Business.
