Marc E. Jaffe

**“Early Childhood Education's Critical Role
in the Connecticut Workforce.”**



Marc Jaffe is a change agent with a significant track record in growing businesses and non-profits. Seven years ago he assumed command as Chief Executive Officer of the Children's Learning Centers of Fairfield County, a leader in early childhood development and education in the greater Stamford area. For Marc “there is no better investment our society can make than investing in our young children. Making a difference in their lives and those of their families is what I'm passionate about doing every single day.” CLC enriches the community by providing high-quality early childhood education and care programs available to families.

In addition to playing a vital role in early childhood education, CLC, along with other non-profits, is a driving force in the Connecticut economy. CLC not only employs over 240 staff, serves nearly 1000 children a day, and enables over 1,500 parents to work, but offers a primary community resource essential to attracting a high quality work force. Mr. Jaffe will discuss the impact of CLC in Southern Connecticut, how it both advances the development of young children and functions as an economic engine for the region.

After earning a B.A in political science and a law degree from Columbia University, Marc held several executive positions in publishing fields across many media and technologies including computer software, videogames, ebooks, video and book publishing. He was the founder and president of Electronics Licensing Organization for nine years and Chairman of the Board of Vizacom, a software publisher that saw annual revenue grow from \$1.2mm to \$38mm. He was President of the Software and Video divisions of Simon & Schuster and was the head of trade book publishing for Rodale Press responsible for the worldwide best seller, the South Beach Diet. He has worked with global brands from Star Trek to Dora the Explorer, Merriam-Webster to Spiderman.

For the past 29 years Marc has been an active supporter of DREAM, formerly Harlem RBI, an organization that provides inner-city youth with opportunities to play, learn and grow, recognize their potential, and realize their dreams. Marc was the first Board President and later the Chair of its Home Run Leadership Council. He was instrumental in the founding not only of Dream but of the Dream Charter School.
