Under the Town Charter, the Board of Estimate and Taxation is "responsible for the proper administration of the financial affairs of the Town." Each year harder decisions have to be made, with the Grand List increasing slowly, Hartford feeling its own economic woes which reduces the amount of State aid available, and the aftermath of Hurricane Sandy pinching on the

revenue side. All this on top of pressures on the Capital Budget, including a \$20 million plea for the new Central Fire House, upgrades to the town's emergency radio and dispatch system, and the uncertain status of environmental remediation costs at the High School. There is a lot happening, and Mike and Steve have joined us to discuss questions and concerns we may have.
