Developments in the Mid East

Mr. Nimr, who was born in the West Bank during the time of the 1967 conflict, grew up in Amman Jordan. His father was a career diplomat serving as the Ambassador of Jordan from 1973 to 1992 in Syria, Germany, Scandinavia, Tunisia, Malta, United Kingdom, Ireland and Egypt

Fluent in Arabic, he is well-informed of ongoing international matters, particularly developments in the Middle East. He has been a guest commentator on MSNBC.com regarding the Middle East and the global political situation. Coming from a family that believes in open dialogue, two of his children attended the "Seeds of Peace" camp and program.

Professionally, Mr. Nimr worked for many years at Citibank both here and abroad in Private Banking, Global Finance, Financial Institutions and Transactions Services, working with Middle Eastern and European financial institution and private bank clients. He also worked at the Arab Jordan Investment Bank and Shearson Lehman Hutton International. In 2001, he established Seabridge Capital, a wealth management company in Southport, CT focusing on super-high net worth non-US families. He is on the boards of China Risk Finance (China's leading consumer credit services provider); and Shanghai Harvest Network Technologies Company, Ltd. (leading distributor and technology innovator of mobile prepaid cards in China)

Mr. Nimr's community service includes serving on the boards of Rushmore House, a non-profit organization that finds and provides scholarship opportunities for Palestinian high school students wishing to study at US colleges and universities; and Greens Farms Academy, an independent co-educational college preparatory day school for grades K-12. He is also a member of the China Institute, the Asia Society and the Council on Foreign Relations.
