The Wastewater Division of the Dep't. of Public Works



There are many aspects of Town life that nobody notices, and indeed don't think much about. We take these Town services for granted, and don't credit those who work hard to provide them, that is until something goes awry. Our sewers and sewerage systems are a prime example of such an essential service.

The Wastewater Division of the Department of Public Works has charge of the construction, maintenance, and repair of all Town sewers and sewerage systems, including the Grass Island Wastewater Treatment Plant and 29 pumping stations. Permits to connect to sewer lines are issued from this office.

Mr. Richard Feminella, the Manager of the Division, will explain the Division's operations, including the separate systems for dealing with sanitary sewage and storm water disposal. More particularly, he will discuss where the water comes from, the collection system that has to receive and transport all wastewater to the Treatment Plant, and the Plant's processes, including nitrogen removal. He will bring us up to date on current issues, focusing on plans to improve the Town's sanitary sewer infrastructure.

Mr. Feminella earned a B.S. in Civil Engineering from Widener University, and holds a professional engineering license from the State of Connecticut. Before joining the Division, he had over 11 years of hands-on design and construction management experience, with clients ranging from the NYC DEP, the NYC School Construction Authority, Nassau, Suffolk, Bergen and Westchester Counties, and many other Tri-State towns and villages. In Greenwich, he has been involved in several award-winning projects, including the Ultraviolet Disinfection Project at Grass Island that received the 2010 Silver Award from the American Council of Engineering Companies. Since he has been with the Town, it has received over \$396,000 in nitrogen credits from the Connecticut DEEP.
