Andrew’s also writes regularly for *Harvard Business Review* and *MIT Sloan Management Review*, and has appeared in major media such as *Bloomberg*, *The Wall Street Journal*, *New York Times*, and CNBC. Andrew is a highly respected and dynamic speaker, reaching audiences of thousands at global executive meetings and at high-profile events like [TED](#). He received degrees in economics, business, and environmental management from Princeton, Columbia, and Yale. Andrew lives in Old Greenwich with his wife Christine (a GHS grad) and two teenage sons.
