TODAY'S SPEAKER

DON CONWAY introduced today's speaker, **Amy Siebert**, Greenwich's Commissioner of Public Works, who highlighted the many and varied areas her department maintains. Some of these include 265 miles of roadway, 10,000 storm drains, 28 waste water pumping stations, 4000 sewer manholes, 30 off street parking areas plus traffic signals and school signs. With a slide show accompanying her talk, Commissioner Siebert illustrated how the town's 75 road and pedestrian bridges are constantly repaired and strengthened and its 145 miles of sidewalks are maintained. The

department is also under seasonal time constraints. 31,000 cubic feet of fallen leaves, enough to fill 96 olympic pools, must be collected in 29 working days before snow falls. She said the public can also aid the department by preventing dog waste from entering catch basins, not pouring kitchen grease down drains and, above all, conserving water.
