Ms. Ragaini holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Nutritional Sciences. She offers counseling at Grade A ShopRite and teaches wellness programming at Norwalk Public Library. The thrust of her talk, aimed at the purchase of food, was "Read The Label." Many supposedly healthy foods are not. Labels such as "veggie" and "gluten free" do not mean healthy. All testimonials are suspect. Terms such as "Natural Product" and "Organic" can be misleading. Skip supplements and avoid fad diets. Her emphasis on healthy eating is to eat food in its natural state and stay away from packaged foods. She advised Mindful Eating and eating when you are hungry and stopping when you are full should be a daily mantra. During the well-voiced Q & A she noted the great interest in diet and nutrition from the RMA.
