### **TODAY'S SPEAKER**

**TAD LARRABEE** introduced Patricia Sesto, Greenwich Director of Environmental Affairs who spoke on history of, causes of, and the impact of sea level rise on Greenwich's infrastructure. She emphasized that sea-level rise is happening NOW and has been happening for as long as measurements have been taken. Scientists have forecast a 12-inch rise in the century 2000-2100. A worst-case scenario predicts as much as a 8.2 feet rise in the same time period. Sealevel rise is due to, among other causes, warming of the seas causing expansion, greater volumes of water due to melting ice run-off, and changes in the geology of seabeds. Other dangers to the environment are due to storm surges (Hurricane Sandy) and increasing high-tide flooding. All these forces can result in, among others, coastal erosion, nuisance flooding (flooded streets), saltwater invasion, septic failure and storm sewer failure. With these dire predictions in mind, the Town of Greenwich has initiated several inter-disciplinary studies to refine the knowledge of the impact(s) of sea-level rise and to come up with practical solutions to deal with nature. The talk was followed by a spirited RMA Q&A.
