President **TAD LARRABEE** opened the meeting at 10:00 AM and called on **MIKE HAYDEN** to lead us in the pledge. **MIKE** then led members in singing *God Bless America* accompanied by **GEORGE STOCKBRIDGE** on the piano. **BOB LUCE** drew laughs with ethnic stories about penurious Scots, who questioned the cost of an obituary and refused to lend a book on suicide for fear it would not be returned.

TAD introduced JOEL BLUMBERG, who informed members of the importance of being vaccinated with a new shingles vaccine called Shingrix. JOEL noted that shingles is a painful rash that can appear years following a bout of chicken pox and in some cases, can cause life-long pain. He noted that Shingrix is given in two doses 2-6 months apart and is believed to be effective for about nine years. Shingrix is currently not easily obtained, although someone in the audience suggested it would be available at CVS around January 18. JOEL urged all members to get a Shingrix vaccination even if they were previously vaccinated for shingles. It has some side effects (e.g. redness at injection site) and may not be covered by some insurance plans.

Pamela Kuhn, leader of Greenwich's Angels Choir, noted that the choir, in association with The Greenwich Arts Council, is beginning a new series of musical salons. The first in this series will be held on January 12th at The Greenwich Arts Council, 299 Greenwich Ave, at 7:30 PM. TODAY'S SPEAKER

Lori Contadino, Director, Commission on Aging – Town of Greenwich, and Steven Katz, Vice-Chairman, Greenwich Commission on Aging, co-presented a review of Greenwich's response to the needs of our aging population. They noted that awareness of such needs arose in large part from standards proposed as a result of surveys done by the World Health Organization (2006) and AARP (2012). The commission's analysis of town data revealed 54.4% of Greenwich's population is 50 years of age or older, and that 28% of households have one or more residents 65 years of age or older. The Greenwich commission, which is supported by an advisory board comprised of representation from all major town departments, commissioned a town survey in 2018 to ascertain the needs of local aging residents. A total of 1800 responses were received, and the commission found that some of the key concerns of respondents included: security; transportation options; affordable housing; responsive government, etc. It was also observed that the impact of dementia among older residents would require programs to support care givers, as well as patients. Overall, the speakers provided significant insights into how Greenwich is responding to the needs of an aging population.
