#### **TODAY'S SPEAKER**

Paul Hicks, a lawyer and writer, discussed his recently published book, *The Litchfield Law School: Guiding the New Nation*. Founded in 1784 by Tapping Reeve, this school is recognized as one of the earliest U.S. law schools. It was unique in that it offered a 14-month curriculum that featured classroom lectures by Reeve instead of the typical 3-5-year apprenticeship in vogue at the time. Its purpose was to promote a national perspective on the law, train lawyers and gain respect for the legal profession. The class notes of Reeve's students, who came from many states, especially from the South, were carefully preserved and formed the foundation of classes later taught at universities such as Harvard and Yale. The influence of the school is illustrated by the number of political leaders that emerged from its program, including 2 Vice Presidents (Burr and Calhoun), 5 Governors of Connecticut and over 100 U.S. Representatives from several states. Mr. Hicks' presentation provided insights into the impact on our nation of this little-known Connecticut school.
