## **TODAY'S SPEAKER**

**STEVE MYERS** introduced Dr. William Baker, Ph.D. who spoke on *The Future of Public Media*. Dr. Baker is well qualified to give perspective on the array of competing programming facing public television and radio. Apart from his visionary efforts in commercial television, Dr. Baker's extraordinary leadership brought WNET/ Channel 13 to the forefront of television viewing when it competed with the three major channels.

But the world has changed bringing with it devices and other methods of viewing, such as streaming content. Viewers are cutting cable viewing, and public media content is automatically dropped. Streaming stations are now commanding the viewer's attention and fees. Netflix viewing is now up to 39% which is well above any other TV offering.

Public television is also faced with reduced government funding. Unlike Switzerland, which contributes \$175 per person, the US contributes about \$1. Despite generous contributions from foundations, the largest portion still comes from individuals. The reach and influence of public television is best illustrated by the following story. "A

toothless and homeless man told Dr. Baker that he watches public TV in a homeless shelter." The man thanked him and gave Dr. Baker five dollars.
