TODAY'S SPEAKER

Was our own **BOB ROBINS**, introduced by HOLLISTER STURGES. BOB was Professor of Political Science at Tulane University. He took his Ph.D at Duke University. His subject today was the 25th amendment of the U.S. Constitution, adopted in 1967. He outlined Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4. BOB and former President Carter were invited to the Pres. Clinton committee that reworked the 25th amendment. Section 1, covers what happens when a President is removed from office resulting from his death or resignation. In these cases, "the Vice President shall become President". Section 2 covers the issues involved when a Vice President is unable to fulfill his responsibilities. In that case, a vote of the full Congress will name a successor. Section 3 specifically addresses the case of a President presenting a written resignation from his office. He is to present it to the Speaker of the House and to the leader pro tempore of the Senate. The Vice President shall then become the Acting President. Section 4 deals with a "contested removal" as in the situation when President Reagan was shot. The Vice President immediately assumes the office of Acting President. Then, a vote of two-thirds of both houses of Congress is required within 21 days to validate the removal.
