

TODAY'S SPEAKER:

JIM FISHBEIN introduced **Draggan Mihailovich**, who has been a producer for CBS 60 Minutes for about 19 years. Mr. Mihailovich described the process by which 60 Minute segments are proposed, selected and aired. He initially covered sports for CBS and has reported on six Olympiads. However, he held the RMA spellbound with his recollection of what he said was his most exciting production: the story of locating and interviewing Louis Zamperini prior to the release of the book and movie entitled *Unbroken*, which is the story of Zamperini's experience as a WWII prisoner of war. What made Mihailovich's presentation all the more fascinating was his recollection of finding and interviewing the brutal Japanese prison guard known as The Bird, who was Zamperini's torturer – and how he came close to bringing Zamperini and The Bird together in the late 1990s
