

Music maven **Christopher Kabala** gave a delightful and informative talk about the music of Johann Sebastian Bach, which he called "The Gold Standard of Western Music". He then illustrated with pictures and music the transition of Western music from the homophony of Renaissance music to the polyphony of the Baroque. He also explained and illustrated these terms.
