TODAY'S SPEAKER

Prior to the speaker being introduced, former member Gary Silberberg made a pitch for members to apply for jobs as census takers in the upcoming 2020 Census. Hours are flexible and pay ranges from \$25.00 to \$27.50 per hour with premium for evenings and weekends. Training and mileage are paid for. Training will begin in mid-March and enumerators will go out in mid-April. In addition to earning some money, Census Takers serve their community by ensuring its accurate representation in Congress and access to government funds for schools, hospitals, roads and more. Today's speaker Howard Husock was then introduced. Husock is a senior fellow and contributing editor at the Manhattan Institute, and a longtime print and television journalist and documentary filmmaker who has won three Emmys for his work. He was director of case studies in public policy and management at the Harvard Kennedy School, and a member of the board of directors of the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (2013-18). His latest book is *Who Killed Civil Society? The Rise of Big Government and the Decline of Bourgeois Norms,* and his subject today, *Effective Ways to Lift People Out of Poverty*.

Husock gave an impassioned plea for private entities to be used to address social problems based on positive values, rather than constantly turning to government to address these problems. "He sees today's massive social service state and government agencies doing more harm than good for struggling communities. He is an advocate for the formative work to be done by civil society through philanthropic activity, as both a source of effective new ideas and a core aspect of democracy and liberty."

Unsurprisingly this led to a lively (and civil) discussion during the question and answer period, in which questions reflected members' very different views on the role of government in addressing social needs. Husock stated that he himself had once been very liberal on social matters, but had concluded that government, while it should play a role, was not "the answer."
