### **TODAY'S SPEAKER**

Our speaker Tom Shachtman gave us a tour of the American Revolution, with emphasis on the economic climate imposed on the States by Great Britain and the financial obstacles the founding leaders faced to obtain the means to prosecute the war. The British Mercantile System dominated the States prior to the Revolution. There were no State banks or corporations. The States were only permitted to sell goods to Great Britain or other States and were required to buy manufactured goods only from Great Britain, which required payment in cash or letters of credit. When the revolt started in 1775 with the battle of Lexington and Concord, the States were faced with the problems of raising an army, how to pay the soldiers, who would lead the military, and how would they acquire the implements of war. Essentially the war was funded by wealthy individuals and war materials were obtained by selling tobacco directly to France in exchange for war material. After the war, the new Republic needed to replace the former mercantile system. The presidencies of George Washington and John Adams established financial institutions primarily of help to the wealthy. The presidencies of Thomas Jefferson and James Madison changed the focus to more favor those nearer the bottom go the financial ladder.
