In 1951, JOHN joined the C.I.A. that year and was later awarded the Intelligence Medal of Merit. Subsequent to his task as Deputy General Counsel in 1974, he ran a private practice of law until retirement in 1994. A loving husband and father, JOHN was an active member

and volunteer with the Unitarian Universalist Church in Arlington, Virginia. He is survived by his wife, his two daughters and three grandchildren.
