#### **TODAY'S SPEAKER**

**PETER UHRY** introduced Katie DeLuca. Director of Planning and Zoning for the Town of Greenwich, who spoke on "Implementing the Plan of Conservation and Development". Ms. DeLuca addressed the desires of a town of 60,000 to embrace development yet maintain its unique characteristics. She outlined several points of concern.

Provide top quality educational facilities, sustain and improve natural landscapes, maintain economic vitality and thriving commercial content and provide best quality infrastructural municipal facilities, cultural institutions and health services. These aims run into the conflicting desires of the town. That is, the need to keep pace with the modern, ever changing world and the hope of avoiding becoming a crowded metropolis. As an example of municipal complications Ms. DeLuca said the town's effort to add green spaces along the Post road corridor runs into state owned properties which are off limit to change by the town.

In the Q and A session New Rochelle and Stamford were cited as examples of over development. The general response was to limit development and maintain status quo.
