TODAY'S SPEAKER

JERRY POLLACK introduced Congressman Jim Himes, our six term
Representative who visits the RMA regularly and really needs no introduction. His talk

was titled *Report from DC*. He divided his talk to four sections: Domestic, Foreign, The Mueller Investigation, and *Politics in 2019*. **DOMESTIC** - He is mildly optimistic, some small progress has been made. The Judicial and Prison Reform Bill, focus on the Opioid Crisis and Cyber security. The current pentagon budget has benefited General Dynamics and United Technologies in Connecticut. He likes that part of the tax bill that lowered corporate rates but wonders how we will pay for it. He has hope for infrastructure and lowering health costs because the President is for them. **FOREIGN** – While he agrees with much of the administration's foreign policy like Syria, North Korea and NATO spending, he disagrees with our Iran policy. He was strongly against the President's approach to diplomacy, pushing away our allies and embracing autocrats. **MUELLER** – He wisely declined to predict what the outcome would be. **POLITICS in 2019**- He proposed that the polarization of politics did not start with the Trump election but started well before then. He saw two main causes of the polarization and offered no startling solutions.

He attributed the cause to the rise of underclasses in our country, black and brown people, women, LGBTQ people, the death of the American Dream, and the rise of social and economic inequality. The only solution he offered was for all citizens to take a greater part in polite public discourse. The Q & A was spirited but polite.
