

TODAY'S SPEAKER

HOLLISTER STURGES introduced Congressman **Jim Himes**, who represents Connecticut's 4th District in the House of Representatives and is a member of the House Committee on Financial Services and of the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence. His presentation was attended by over 200 members and guests.

In his comments, he focused on the state of our politics, on social issues, and on what he sees to be his own role. He noted that recent economic and political changes have affected different population segments differently, and that the resulting different perspectives too often find expression as rage, rather than as ideas for resolution of issues. There are indications of some positive movement in such areas as investment in infrastructure and tax reform. He strongly feels the need to resist false news and threats to foundational citizenship rights, but wants to encourage the exchange of new ideas. He encouraged us to expect more of ourselves. His remarks were well received.
