**EULOGY:** HARRY TWITCHELL eulogized AL HARTIG, who passed away on February 12, 2016 at 94 years old. AL was born in New York City on April 26, 1921 and attended Hamilton College in Clinton, NY. He was inducted into the US Army in 1942 and served

in the South Pacific. He was active in the Red Cross, Meals on Wheels and the RMA. A memorial service will be held at the 2nd Congregational Church on Saturday, Feb. 27 at 11:00am.

#### **TODAY'S SPEAKER**

Tom Niles, former diplomat, gave an illuminating talk and focused on two issues; the Middle East and the European Union. Using history going back to World War I he showed that many of the problems in the Middle East today were created by the haphazard division of tribal lands by England and France. The underlying tensions there are exacerbated by the mounting refugee crises emanating from the war in Syria.

Europe, aided greatly by the United States' Marshall Plan after World War II, is attempting to maintain its Union while some of its nations are struggling with debt. The problems are increased also by the refugees spilling across borders. It is estimated that one million refugees are seeking refuge with another 800,000 on the way.
