## **TODAY'S SPEAKER**

**TED SPOOL** introduced **Dan Marcy**, a member of the New NY Bridge Project's out reach team who caught our attention with his presentation of "Building a New Bridge Over the Tappan Zee". Mr. Marcy reviewed past efforts to build the bridge over the Hudson River adding that Governor Cuomo had set the project in motion with unions and financial sources in 2012. Two bridges with four lanes each will be built for a total cost of \$3.98 billion. Pedestrian and bicycle paths will also be provided with full completion expected in 2018. A combined slide and video presentation was very effective in viewing the progress of the construction and hearing workers' enthusiastic comments.
