TODAY'S SPEAKER: James Lee, C.O.O. of New York Presbyterian/ Lawrence Hospital Center discussed the ever growing consolidation in the hospital industry, as hospitals merge and buy up physician practices, creating fewer but ever larger institutions. The underlying question is one of value, the nexus of cost and quality of service delivered. On the one hand, some believe that since hospitals and providers compete with each other, mergers allow them to eliminate competition and drive up prices. Others believe that only larger institutions with capital and concentration and integrated services can meet the tremendous accountability that's required of hospitals today.
