TODAY'S SPEAKER

Paula Hopewell; freelance Lincoln historian speaking on *"Abraham Lincoln and the Border Region: Perspectives from the Mason-Dixon Line"*. Ms. Hopewell presented an

idiosyncratic view of Abraham Lincoln's life and times, concentrating on the influence of his Kentucky roots on his life and presidency. FYI, the Ohio River which separates Kentucky, a slave state that did not secede, and Ohio, a free state, is the Mason-Dixon line in that area. Hopewell, a former math major, spent some time analyzing the elections of 1860 and 1864. We learned, for instance, that in 1864 Lincoln only garnered 44% of the vote in Greenwich. It was a fact-filled, interesting presentation. The usual spirited RMA Q&A followed.
