TODAY'S SPEAKER

Our speaker, Page Knox, gave a fascinating illustrated lecture on John Singer Sargent, (1856-1925) an American who studied and painted in Paris in the 1880's and 1890's. Ms. Knox based her talk on a recent exhibition of John Singer Sargent at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. She told us that he spent almost his whole life in Europe as an expatriate. After his success in being admitted to the select circle of artists at the Salon in 1879, when he was only 25 years old, he began to accept commissions to paint for his European and American friends who had the money to pay for them. He was a great admirer of the Spanish painter Velasquez, court painter to Philip II in the 16th century, and studied carefully the subtleties of Velasguez' shading of black and white. They are reflected in most of Sargent's works. His golden era was in the 1880s, 1890s and early 1900's. Perhaps his "tour de force" was his "Madame X" painting. She was actually an American by the name of Ms. Guidry. He sketched, then painted her in an almost strapless black velvet evening dress, very revealing and startling. He kept the painting with him showing it in Europe and the U.S. until her death in the early 1900's. His commissions steadily became much more frequent and costly. He painted in England's Cotswold Hills, was exhibited in Florence's Uffizi Palace, in London's National Gallery, and painted the ceilings and frescoes for Boston's Public Library in the early 1900's. Sargent retreated from portrait painting in 1905, evolved to landscapes, buildings' interiors, and, during World War One he painted battle scenes. He died at age 69 in 1925. Sargent was among America's most famous painters of the 20th century.
