TODAY'S SPEAKER

Terry Gallagher, filling in for her husband, Charles Adams, who was in the hospital, introduced Bea Blahing, to talk about the survival of indigenous people. Bea Blahing is in Lake Sebu, of Mindanao. Philippines. She describes herself as an 11,000 year old woman. That is, the wisdom and knowledge of her 11,000 year old "great mother" is within her.

Indigenous peoples such as her tribe, one of many on MindAnao, are living examples of different values from those of the modern world - such as sharing freely, caring for and supporting members of the community, communal property, and taking care of the forest with its unique species. These differences are what make them valuable to the modern world. Survival of her people is under severe pressure from colonizers from other parts of the Philippines, with their greed and oppression. She is a member of the corps of community organizers, Earthwalkers, which is working for the survival and the legal rights of her people.
