TODAY'S PROGRAM

GERRY GIBIAN presented Dr. James Rosoff, Assistant Professor of Urology at Yale Medical School, and his talk on "Prostate Cancer Screening: Pros and Cons". Dr. Rosoff is also the Attending Urologist at Greenwich Hospital. While the subject of any cancer is frightening Dr. Rosoff pointed out that since the early 1990's early screening has resulted in a mortality decrease of as much as 4% per year. It is the largest decrease of any cancer. Screening for PSA (Prostate Specific Antigen) has to be approached carefully. Age, race, family history and life expectancy should be taken into account. He cautioned that active surveillance is vital. Questions from the members showed an intense interest in the subject.
