TODAY'S SPEAKER

David Medd has been with the Aquarion Water Company since 1992 directing operations for the supply, treatment, pumping and water storage for the Greenwich-Darien area. The State is in the midst of one of the worst three year drought periods in the last 100 years. Outdoor irrigation is generally banned but some outdoor water uses are allowed, such as drip irrigation and hand held watering. Rainfall and stream flows have been below normal but sufficient quantities of water are expected to be available for essential uses.
