TODAY'S SPEAKER

PETE MCSPADDEN introduced Tom Niles, former United States Ambassador to Canada, the European Union and Greece. Ambassador Niles directed his comments to touch two areas, the Euro Union and the Middle East. He started off with the somewhat unusual election in June in the U.K., unusual due to the new and growing Scots National Party and the U.K. Independence Party that are luring voters from the existing Conservative and Labor Parties. Greece is running out of money and having difficulty raising an approaching Euro Union Loan repayment. Hopefully they will not leave the Euro Union thereby causing extreme disruption in Europe. Russia continues to cause concern even as sanctions exist, some information indicates future Russian meddling in Estonia, Lithuania and Latvia. Treaty borders in the Middle East after WWI have caused rivalries between religious and political entities that had a healthier existence under previous empires or governments. The new Israel coalition government has a difficult time ahead. Regarding Iran/U.S agreement, it is possible. If Congress rejects it, we may lose many allies.
