JERRY POLLACK introduced Matthew West, a Project Coordinator for Doctors Without Borders who shared his experience providing logistic support to this dedicated group of medical professionals.

Mr. West started his talk with a short video on Doctors Without Borders, or as it is known MSF (the acronym for the "Doctors Without Borders" in French). MSF is a nonprofit medical and humanitarian organization. Its mission is to provide emergency aid to people in developing countries affected by wars, epidemics, natural disasters or in areas where medical care is not available. Currently they have 450 programs on-going in 76 countries. There are 40,000 field workers, medical and support, and 90% of the field workers are locals. In addition to a myriad of medical services MSF provides infrastructure projects including building clinics and other medical facilities, providing clean water and waste systems. They also supply medical and administrative training. It is a very impressive organization. West's role in logistics provided huge challenges in places without roads, electricity or adequate communication facilities. He shared some specific experiences from his six years in the field for MSF. The talk was inspiring as well as informative. For more information go to <u>www.doctorswithoutborders.org</u>.
