TODAY'S SPEAKER

GEROGE UBOGY introduced his colleague, Dr. Saul A Rothenberg, a clinical psychologist serving at the Greenwich Hospital Sleep Disorder Center, speaking on *Sleep Well, Age Well; Tips on getting the sleep you need.*

Dr. Rothenberg started by making the point that good sleep was as important as a good diet and exercise for aging well. He went on to describe what defines "normal" sleep and the factors that prevent us from experiencing "normal" sleep and providing some tips for achieving the sleep we all need. Although aging may affect our ability to experience "sound sleep", our need for sleep does not diminish with age. It is a constant for each individual.
