# TODAY'S SPEAKER

STEVE MYERS introduced Dr. Robin Bell, Ph.D. who spoke on the topic of *Changing* Ice, Changing Coast lines. Dr. Bell is the PGI Lamont Research Professor at Lamont-Doherty Earth Observatory of Columbia University. She directs research programs in Antarctica, Greenland, and for developing technology to monitor our changing planet. She reminded us that she is a spokesperson for large teams of people since science is actually a team sport requiring large numbers of people and sufficient funding. We live on a glacierized landscape. Twenty thousand years ago, Greenwich, CT, was covered under a mountain of ice. Glaciers are known to move at approximately 6 miles per year. She cited three pieces of evidence that the ice sheets are changing. Ice is moving faster, getting lower and losing mass when compared to data from the recent past. In the last one hundred years, sea level in Manhattan has risen about nine inches. However, there are a small number of locations such as Stockholm, Sweden, where sea level has actually decreased. While there have been significant findings regarding ice and glaciers, there is still a great deal of uncertainty. Therefore, the scientific community must stay informed, must be thoroughly engaged in their research and must demand support from agencies. institutions and government.
