### **TODAY'S SPEAKER**

The speaker, **Cynthia MacKay**, was introduced by her husband ARTHUR STAMPLEMAN. She gave an excellent exposition on macular degeneration. It is the number one cause of blindness in people 65 and over, and that it passes from one generation to the next. We oldsters have a 1 in 3 risk of getting MD, she said. MD literally obliterates the center of what the eye sees. She explained that the macula is at the extreme rear of the retina. She warned us that we should avoid certain activities or behaviors, such as, smoking, which multiplies your vulnerability to MD by 3 to 5 times, large doses of Lipitor, the use of Lasik drugs, saturated fats, e.g. fat meats and being overweight. She counseled us to see our ophthalmologist yearly. A lively Q and A followed.
