# TODAY'S SPEAKER

JERRY POLLAK introduced DAVID WEISBROD, an RMA member, who spoke on "The 2008 Crash: View From the Trenches". Mr. Weisbrod, former Chief Risk Officer of Treasuries and Securities at JP Morgan Chase, introduced us to the Triparty Repo Market.

This interdependent grouping consists of three financial elements: Investors, Borrowers and Clearing Banks. In the daily interchange of this \$2 trillion money market, if one of these entities were to falter, it would bring down the other two. In 2008 this scenario came perilously close to occurring.

Mr. Weisbrod focused on the fragile situation at Lehman Brothers, whose pledged collateral consisted of faulty real estate loans that were included in mortgage-backed security funds. During a frantic September weekend, when Mr. Weisbrod was hosting his daughter's wedding, he was also fielding calls from his company and the NY Federal Reserve.

Lehman Brothers did collapse but successful financial moves managed to avoid total collapse of the money market. Mr. Weisbrod noted that the resulting passage of the Dodd Frank bill now addresses some of the weaknesses in the system that led to the Great Recession.
