PETER SCHIEFERDECKER announced that the speaker today would be Jim Campbell, WGCH radio personality and author of the new book, *Madoff Talks: Uncovering the Untold Story Behind the Most Notorious Ponzi Scheme in History*. **ARNOLD GORDON** then told the group that next week's speaker will be Zooming from Israel, and will speak on "Musical Bridges: Bringing Together Arab and Jewish Communities in Israel." This is a fascinating story about Polyphony Conservatory, an organization dedicated to youth and community development which brings together talented musicians of all faiths and ethnicity from throughout the country in an effort to overcome long-existing cultural boundaries.

TODAY'S SPEAKER

The day's speaker, Jim Campbell, was jointly introduced by **PETER SCHIEFERDECKER** and a representative of the Greenwich Public Library. Jim lives in Greenwich and is known for his nationally syndicated radio show, *Business Talk with Jim Campbell*. He spent years communicating with the imprisoned Bernie Madoff, gaining his trust and becoming his prison "pen pal." Jim also extensively interviewed members of the Madoff family, in an attempt to figure out how one man had managed to run a \$65 billion Ponzi scheme for 40 years without getting caught.

The result was Jim's new book, *Madoff Talks: Uncovering the Untold Story Behind the Most Notorious Ponzi Scheme in History,* released, ironically, just days after Madoff's death in a North Carolina prison in April 2021. Jim began by describing the explosion in interest in the book which came as a result of this coincidence, including national interviews and major newspaper features. He then went on to engagingly describe the results of his research,

which pointed to several factors behind Madoff's audacious scheme. Among these were his desire not to repeat the failures of his businessman-father; his burning desire to never appear to lose money on any transaction; his resentment at greedy Wall Street investors and the realization that they were willing to look the other way if they thought he was making them money; the incompetence of government regulators; and his extremely controlling nature, and cleverness, which allowed him to compartmentalize his activities in a way that no one, except him, could see the whole picture of what was really going on. Regarding the morality of what he was doing, according to Jim he was basically delusional.

Madoff actually ran two investment firms, one completely above-board and squeaky clean, and the other the shadowy entity that executed the Ponzi scheme. Because of his good reputation from the first, both investors and regulators seemed to miss the second one.

Jim's talk was followed by a lively Q&A, and a book signing arranged by Diane's Books.
