In honor of July 4th, **MICHAEL** read aloud a newspaper article about the life stories of the 56 signatories of the Declaration of Independence. Five of them died after torture. Mr. Ashkar is co-founder of "Polyphony," a classical music school and performance group which since 2012 has been making a serious effort to calm the troubled waters in Palestine and Israel.

BOB PHILLIPS previewed next week's speaker, Mark Nunan, Ph.D, who will speak to us on "Fiorello LaGuardia: Scourge of the Old Order, Inventor of the New". Dr. Nunan recently provided us with a stimulating talk on Robert Moses. La Guardia took office in 1934, during the Great Depression, and succeeded beyond all expectations, and his life story is a fascinating one.

Book Review: MICHAEL AMBROSINO gave us a brief and glowing review of the best-seller *The Midnight Library* by Matt Haig. The book's premise is of an alternate universe "what if" reflection on one's life. It hypothesizes that we consider the possibility of "the path not taken". It is about choices, regrets, and embracing life.

TODAY'S SPEAKER

Nabeel Abboud-Ashkar was introduced by **ARNOLD GORDON**. Mr. Ashkar spoke to us via Zoom from Nazareth--the longest-distance Zoom conference we have had to date. Nabeel is a graduate of Tel Aviv University, with a degree in physics. Born in Nazareth, he developed an interest in classical music at an early age, inspired by his father's passion for this medium. Nabeel took up the violin at the age of eight, and his brother became an accomplished pianist. Our speaker went on to obtain a master's degree in music from the Hochschule fur Musik in Rostock, Germany. He returned to Nazareth in 2006 and performed with the Youth Orchestra in the West Bank. This evolved into the "Polyphony" Conservatory", which was dedicated to bringing together young people of all backgrounds to perform excellent symphony music in the region, in an effort to break barriers and overcome long-existing cultural obstacles. Aided by 20 excellent teachers, the initial cadre of 21 students grew and was able to participate in competitions after their third year. A video of 22-year-old violinist Yamin Saadi was presented. (In 2020, Saadi won the most prestigious music prize in Israel.) Polyphony reaches 10,000 children from kindergarten to sixth grade in its teaching of music appreciation. The program for young musicians included ten Nazarenes and ten Israelis, and has now grown to 36 musicians. Their Galilee Chamber Orchestra is scheduled to debut at Carnegie Hall next March. Additional videos from 2012 and 2019 (Berlin--Schubert's Trout) were presented. A Q&A session, moderated by **ARNOLD GORDON**, was replete with praise for this use of music to build bridges in times of conflict.
